## From the Pastor..



I hope you are enjoying the warmer weather as much as I am. I love that we're having a little bit more daylight as well. These shifts remind us that spring is on the way and that Easter is just around the corner. Before we rush into Easter, however, we need to examine ourselves by focusing on Lent.

Lent literally means "lengthening" as in the lengthening of days moving toward spring. We can also take its meaning to be stretching – as in stretching ourselves to grow in faith. It is a time we remember Jesus' forty days of temptation in which he rejected Satan and reaffirmed God's will for his life.

Though many Baptists do not observe Lent, what better way to prepare for Easter than rooting out the evil in our lives and reaffirming God's will for ourselves? Lent isn't just about "giving up something." Lent is about embracing our faith and making room for what's right and holy.

We began Lent a few days ago with an Ash Wednesday Service that was moving and meaningful. We will continue in Lent until Easter Sunday, April 16. During this time Larry and I will be bringing a series of sermons entitled: Respecting God's Commandments.

On Wednesday evenings will all come back together and Larry and I will delve more deeply into the Ten Commandments. Together we will focus on Respecting God, Respecting the Rhythms of Life, Respecting Our Heritage, Respecting One Another and Respecting Ourselves.

I look forward to being with you for as many of these sermons and studies as possible, but my health will dictate how much I'm able to lead. Right now, it looks like I will be facing surgery in the latter part of March and will be out for at least two weeks. It is my hope is to rejoin you on Easter Sunday!
